Summer Camp 2021 FAQ

Where will Summer Camp be held this year?

We are excited to bring our Summer Camp Program back to 135 Forest Avenue. All campers will be dropped off any picked up at this location. We do not provide transportation to and from home.

Will there be a Mandatory Parent Orientation?

Yes, all parents of Campers (whether Day Camp or Travel Camp) must attend one of the following Orientation Dates:

- Wednesday, June 30 @ 6pm
- Thursday, July 1 @9:30am

Meeting will be held at Grenville Baker Boys & Girls Club, 135 Forest Ave in Locust Valley.

How large are the camp groups?

Group size will be limited to no more than 10 campers. Different stable groups of campers will have no or minimal contact with another group to the greatest extent possible. The camp group will remain with the same staff whenever and wherever possible.

Can parents enter the facility?

At this time, we will prohibit all parents and visitors from entering the facility. Drop off and pick up will take place outside.

How will you practice social distancing?

Program spaces and activities and interaction with campers, will be designed to practice social distancing. This may include visual reminders, verbal cues, table and chair arrangements and daily safety meetings.

Do children have to wear a mask?

Campers will be required to wear a mask when engaged in an activity where social distancing from other campers is not possible.

Will staff be wearing a mask?

Any time that an employee is interacting with a camper, they must wear a face covering.

What kind of activities will campers participate in?

We will offer activities that involve less physical closeness, as well as activities that will not involve shared equipment. Social Distancing will be kept to the greatest extent possible during all activities. Some activities will include arts and crafts, outdoor games, STEM, and other independent activities that do not require physical contact.

Will there be field trips this summer?

The on-site Day Camp will participate in 1 field trip a week. Schedule to be determined. Travel Camp offers field trips on a daily basis. Registration is first come first served until capacity is reached. The Trip Schedule is subject to change due to availability, weather, and any other unforeseen circumstance that may arise.

How will the site be sanitized?

We will be increased the frequency of site sanitation to include sanitation of frequently touched surfaces in program areas in between transitions.

How often will campers practice hand hygiene?

Campers and staff will wash hands (or use hand sanitizer) upon arrival to the first program activity, between all program activities, after using the restroom, before eating and before departing at the end of the day.

Will there be a health screening upon arrival to camp each day?

Yes, we will be conducting a health screening of all campers and staff each day which will include a temperature check and a questionnaire about COVID-19 related symptoms. Staff will monitor children throughout the day for signs and symptoms of COVID-19.

What happens if a parent or camper tests positive for COVID-19?

In the event that a parent/guardian must be isolated because they have tested positive for, or exhibited symptoms of COVID-19, the parent/guardian must be advised that they cannot enter the site for any reason, including the picking up of their child. An authorized emergency contact must come to pick up the camper. As a "close contact", the camper must not return to day camp for the duration of the quarantine. If the camper becomes symptomatic and/or tests positive, they may not return to camp until after the quarantine is complete. Refunds will be offered in these situations.
